Renovation of the Library is Underway

The Community Will Soon Have the Larger, More Modern Library It Deserves!

The renovation of the former Cornerstone/Erb Hardware building at 5th and D Streets will be underway soon. The architects, Castellaw Kom, completed the design, bids were advertised and on August 6th the City Council awarded the bid to Interwest Construction Co. of North Salt Lake, Utah. While the low bidder was not local, the major sub-contractors for plumbing, electrical and HVAC are local. It is expected the construction time will be 6-8 months.

While not extravagant, the building will be pleasing as well as functional. Many of the features of the historical building are incorporated into the design, i.e. some of the brick walls, wooden flooring and open ceiling beams. The area is open with plenty of natural light. The book shelves will be low and easily reachable; there will be ample sitting/reading areas, an expanded computer center, a teen center, large children's area for story time, a medium size meeting room and more efficient volunteer work areas

We are only able to have this new library because of the many generous donations by community members and businesses. This public/private

partnership is recognized as the most successful one in Idaho as evidenced by a recent award from the Association of Idaho Cities.


Donations that Make a Difference
